Friday's City Tour coaches will board at 9:00 AM at the MMC for a five hour excursion with stops at selected sites including one for lunch (on our own) in Sausalito, a quaint village just over the Golden gate bridge. We'll return in time to give those going to the Athletics-Rangers game a few hours to recharge. By 5:00 PM they should be walking to the BART (Bay Area Rapid Transit) station for the 22 minute ride to Oakland.

Saturday luncheon in the Crystal Ballroom – preceded by cocktails in the Hospitality Suite - will be an opportunity for business attire. MACCS's own Brigadier General Mike Mulqueen is the speaker. The rest of the day is on your own. Saturday evening you may want to take in a show. We finish with Breakfast Sunday and begin waiting for 2010.
